





Terms and Conditions for awarding Travel Grants in the form of Interrail Global Passes

The **Schwarzkopf Foundation** Young Europe awards in cooperation with **Deutsche Bahn AG Interrail Global Passes** to give young people between 17 and 27 years the opportunity to travel in Europe and explore climate-friendly travel-possibilities and mobility in Europe.

- 1. The travel grant includes an Interrail Global Pass for 30 European countries, including Turkey and Russia, equivalent to 372 €. It allows to travel on 15 days within a month. - 2. The travel has to be done under the working topic of "Protecting the climate and mobility in Europe how can we take part in countering climate change?"
- 3. Deadline for applications is **March 19th, 2017**. The foundation notifies applicants of the selection results as soon as possible. The trip can't start earlier than May 1st.
- 4. Young people between 17 and 27 of who have permanently lived in the EU, Russia or Turkey may apply for a trip with the Interrail Global Pass.
- 5. The applicants freely choose the countries they wish to travel to. The Interrail-Global-Pass is also valid on the first and last travel date within the country of residence of the applicant from the border to their home address.
- 6. Not later than three months after completing the journey the awardee is requested to submit a report of the trip to the Schwarzkopf Foundation and the Deutsche Bahn. The report needs to explain how the research topic was addressed, the concrete findings and a reflection on the experiences and impressions from the trip. This can be done in the form of an Instagram or Flickr photo story, a blog, a vlog or a written report.
- 7. The awardee agrees with the publication of her or his report by the Foundation, e.g. on the websites or channels of the Deutsche Bahn and/or the Schwarzkopf Foundation.
- 8. The trip has to be planned and carried out exclusively by the recipient and should last three to four weeks.
- 9. Applications can be submitted in English or German language via the online application form. With the application are expected:
 - Details about the planned travel route and how it supports the research of the project
 - A detailed plan for the project report, including the chosen channel(s) for publication and the content of the report.
- 10. After being accepted the awardee informs the Schwarzkopf Foundation about the fixed start of his/her travel. The foundation send the awardee a form to fill in and send further to the Deutsche Bahn, who then issue for and send the Interrail Global Pass to the awardee. From that time onwards the date of the start of the travel is fixed; a change of time is not possible.
- 11. In case these terms are not met the awardee is obliged to pay the price of the Interrail Global Pass to the Schwarzkopf Foundation.
